Skill India is touching new heights by providing apprenticeship training to graduates and postgraduates. In a first-of-its kind apprenticeship programme for non-technical graduates, up to 5 lakh students from across universities/colleges will join various industries and service sectors from July 2019. CSDCI is continuously matching the demand with the opportunities available and will come up with opportunities for registered candidates in the month of May and place the students for apprenticeships.

5L Non-Technical Graduates To Get Internships With ₹6,000/Mth Stipend

New Delhi: In a first-of-its kind apprenticeship programme for non-technical graduates, up to 5 lakh students from across universities/colleges will join various industries and service sectors from July 2019.

According to human resource development ministry officials, over 9.25 lakh students from 1,533 non-technical universities/colleges have applied for the minimum six-month internship, called Scheme for Higher Education Youth for Apprenticeship and Skills (Shreyas), by the end of the registration deadline of March 25.

Apart from the assured Rs 6,000 per month stipend, the students will also get Rs 1,500 reimbursement by the Centre, making it the biggest skilling programme in the country.

The Shreyas programme

The students will also receive Rs 1,500 reimbursement by the government of India, apart from the Rs 6,000 monthly stipend

The combined amount makes it the biggest skilling programme in the country

Majority of the 9.25 lakh students who have applied for the programme are from southern states and Maharashtra



has been conceived by the government with the objective of introducing employable skills into learning, promote apprenticeship as integral to education, and also amalgamate employment facilitating efforts of the government into the education system.

Shreyas, an initiative of the HRD ministry, ministry of skill development and entrepreneurship, and the ministry of la-

bour and employment was launched in February 2019. According to R Subrahmanyam, MHRD's higher education secretary, "A majority of the students are from the southern states and Maharashtra."

"A minimum of 3 lakh students are going to get their apprenticeships from July 2019 and it could well go up to 5 lakh in the first year," added Subrahmanyam.

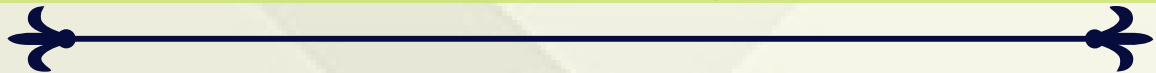
