Greetings from Construction Skill Development Council Of India (CSDCI)!

Standardisation of NSQF Assessments for qualification packs under construction sector

Skill assessments based on occupational standards are relatively a new concept in India. The national skill qualification framework of India (NSQF) comprises of 10 competency levels. The least complex level being NSQF level 1 and the max. complex competency level being NSQF level 10. CSDCI has developed qualification packs for 102 job roles up to NSQF level 6.

We face lot of challenges during skill assessment and NSQF certifications. Few challenges include standardisation of assessments, selecting appropriate mode of assessments considering the illiterate to semiliterate workers in construction field, setting a practically feasible duration of assessments etc. To overcome these challenges, we have designed an assessment criteria frame work at CSDCI.

An assessment criteria reduce the possibility of different interpretations of the assessment requirements.

This frame work consists of assessment criteria inputs based on each NOS in a qualification pack. The critical and major skill required for performing a task based on National occupational standard is defined in each criteria sheet. Also the underpinning knowledge required in performing the skill task is given in the criteria sheet.

The weightage/marks are given against each criteria point. This assessment criterion helps in developing assessment tools/questions which is valid and sufficient to measure the standard outcomes.

To improve the quality of assessments, CSDCI is designing sample set of questions with the help of domain experts and construction skill Assessors. We are consulting with construction industry experts during question setting with respect to the outcome produced, tolerances, time taken to complete the task etc. This will ensure the assessments being conducted in line with the industry requirements and also will get more acceptance to the candidates by industry.

The samples set of questions job role wise will be uploaded at CSDCI website. The duration and mode of assessments are pre-set at CSDCI in consultation with domain experts to ensure uniformity in assessments across NSQF level 1-6.

The Assessment criteria and sample questions will guide the skill echo system including Assessors, training providers, academic institutions and job holders in construction domain to understand the competency expectations/requirements of the construction industry for each job role. It will help in bringing more transparency and quality to assessment processes.

Meeting on a Digital Initiative by L&T

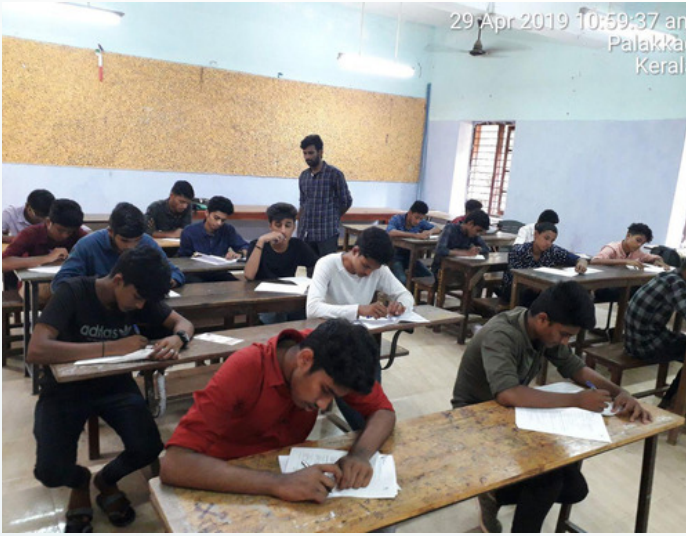

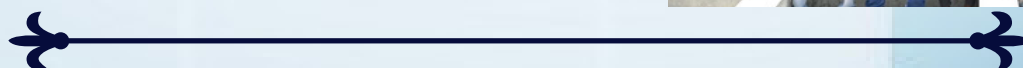
