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APPRENTICESHIP CORNER

Reimbursement of stipend claim:

There are two ways for making payment to Apprentices – directly through Apprenticeship portal or when the stipend has been paid by the establishment through their internal payment process.

Disbursement processed by National Skill Development Corporation (NSDC) under NAPS Scheme where the stipend has been paid by the establishment through their internal payment process. Post payout of apprenticeship stipend, the establishment will submit the claim form on quarterly basis, through their login into the Apprenticeship Portal. Before the establishment submits any claims, they need to ensure that the following details mentioned in the profile section for themselves in Apprenticeship Portal are correct (to avoid any processing delays):

- ❖ Bank Account information in which the reimbursement needs to be processed by NSDC.
- ❖ PAN Number (Permanent Account Number issued by Income Tax department)



NSDC and British Asian Trust roll out first-of-its-kind 'Skill India Impact Bond'

In an interview, National Skill Development Corporation (NSDC) Managing Director and CEO Manish Kumar shared that through the Skill India Impact Bond (SIB), NSDC will be able to catalyze the entry of impact investors and private sector outcome funders into the skills training space.
