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## APPRENTICESHIP CORNER

### *--Assessment and Certification by Establishments (non-NAPS)*

*After completion of apprenticeship training, apprentices will need to go through an assessment to be conducted by the establishment. Certificates will be awarded by the establishments to apprentices based on marks obtained by them in the assessment by the establishment.*

### *--Assessment and Joint Certification under NAPS*

*Under NAPS, and in cases where the employer/ establishment opts for Joint certification, the assessment will be conducted jointly by the establishment and the concerned Sector Skill Council. The theory part of this assessment would be online to be conducted through the concerned SSC while the practical would be conducted by the employer at the shop floor premises and would be evidence-based. In such cases, the certificates will be awarded to apprentices who pass the assessment jointly by the establishment and the concerned Sector Skill Council. The assessment details will be uploaded on the portal and certificates will be generated electronically.*



## Govt to amend Apprenticeship Act to enhance opportunities for youth: Sitharaman

To enhance opportunities for youth, the government on Monday proposed to amend the Apprenticeship Act and realign the National Apprenticeship Training Scheme for a post-education apprenticeship, training of graduates and diploma holders in engineering.

Presenting the Budget for 2021-22 in Parliament, finance minister Nirmala Sitharaman said over Rs 3,000 crore will be set aside for this purpose.

The National Apprenticeship Training Scheme for providing post-education apprenticeship, training of graduates and diploma holders in Engineering shall be realigned and over Rs, 3,000 crore will be provided for this purpose.

"We also have a collaborative Training Inter Training Programme between India and Japan to facilitate the transfer of Japanese industrial and vocational skills, technique, and knowledge. We will take forward this initiative with many more countries," Sitharaman said..

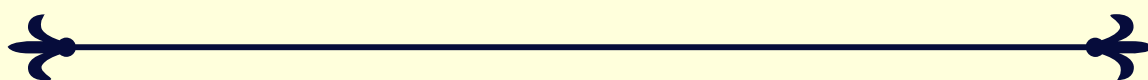


## Vocational Courses to be introduced phase-wise in schools to expose students to skill development

Vocational courses will be introduced phase-wise in schools for Classes 9 to 12 to expose students to skill development avenues, as part of the Centre's flagship skilling scheme Pradhan Mantri Kaushal Vikas Yojana 3.0 , according to the Economic Survey 2020-21 tabled in Parliament.

The Survey for the financial year ending March said merely 2.4 percent of India's workforce in the age group of 15-59 years have received formal vocational or technical training, while another 8.9 percent obtained training through informal sources.

Out of the 8.9 percent workforce who received non-formal training, the largest chunk is contributed by on-the-job training (3.3 percent), followed by self-learning (2.5 percent) and hereditary sources (2.1 percent) and other sources (1 percent)," the survey stated. It said the most sought-after training course by those who received formal training was IT-ITeS among both males and females.
